

What is a microfiche in a newspaper?

The National Library in Kolkata maintains extensive newspaper archives on roll microfilm, allowing researchers to access historical publications dating back decades without handling the fragile originals. Microfiche consists of flat sheets of film containing multiple microimages arranged in a grid pattern.

When did microfilming become a standard preservation method?

By the 1950s and 1960s, microfilming had become a standardized preservation method in libraries worldwide. The U.S. Library of Congress established comprehensive microfilming programs, as did the National Archives and many university libraries across India and globally.

When did microfilming start?

The history of microfilming begins in the early 19th century, marking the start of a technological revolution in document preservation that would transform how libraries and archives manage their collections for generations. In 1839, John Benjamin Dancer, an English scientist and inventor, created the first microfilmed document.

Why is microfilm important?
